## Legislation update:

In June 2020 I sent out an alert about Bill C-7, the federal government is looking to make changes to the assisted suicide legislation. How very serious this is as they propose to loosen the requirements to Medical Assistance in Dying. The proposed changes address among other things, concerns around who is eligible for MAID, the role of palliative care, and the role of consent.

In my last directive I included a sample letter that opposed Bill C-7. I'd like to thank those of you who had the opportunity to write to your Member of Parliament on this very serious issue however, if you did not, I encourage you to do it now.
